The new stage – plus audio equipment – is being formally opened by Mike Carey, whose late wife Brenda campaigned vigorously for the facility.

Mr Carey was awarded the British Empire Medal in last year's New Year's Honours List for his own services to the community.

The event is being organised by the Friends of Silsden Town Hall, who successfully applied for a £10,000 grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund for the stage and equipment.
